## DID YOU KNOW?

The Town of Purcellville treats and delivers more than 200 million gallons of water each year? There are two primary sources of water: the Town's reservoirs, located at the base of the Blue Ridge Mountains, and wells located throughout the Town. The reservoir is considered "surface water," which requires treatment at the Town's Water Treatment Plant, located on Short Hill Mountain Road. The Town produces about half of its daily water use at this facility. The remaining water comes from wells located at Short Hill Mountain and throughout Town. Treatment occurs as needed at each location to ensure water quality standards are met. With these various sources of water, the Town has redundancy in its production capabilities.

## Help Plan Purcellville



Did you know that the Town of Purcellville is updating our comprehensive plan? We need YOU to help plan Purcellville's future, and you can start by visiting [PlanPurcellville.com](http://PlanPurcellville.com) to keep track of the process and provide your input.

Do you know why the comprehensive plan is important to you? A comprehensive plan is an official public document adopted by the Town that articulates the community's vision for its future, and it serves as the foundation for decision-making and future development. That means its goals, policies, and recommendations can guide and effect issues ranging from small matters such as where new sidewalks should be constructed to big issues like traffic and taxes.

The Town is currently guided by the Purcellville, Virginia 2025 Comprehensive Plan which was adopted in 2006. A lot has changed around here since then. Because of this, the Town Council and the Planning Commission have made updating the comprehensive plan a top priority to ensure that it continues to accurately reflect the needs and desires of Purcellville residents. That is why it is vitally important to hear from all parts of the community during this process, so we really need your input for this process to be successful.

# Department Spotlight: MAINTENANCE

Snow Removal. Street Maintenance. Sidewalk Repair. Sewer Backups. Water and Sewer Line Maintenance. The list of responsibilities handled by the Town of Purcellville's Maintenance Department is nearly endless. Not only are they responsible for the safe and continuous operation of all Town facilities, but they respond to citizen issues and infrastructure needs, too.


One of the most visible activities of the Maintenance Department was put to the test this winter during the Blizzard of 2016. When more than three feet of snow fell, the Town's dedicated staff worked around the clock to keep roads clear and passable. By noon on the second day, all Town-maintained roads were passable, a testament to the incredible effort put in by our snow-plowing crews. The Town is able to put a plow on almost every maintenance truck, and we also have a front-end loader, a special skid-steer loader, and small Toolcat with both a blower and plow. The specialized equipment helps the Town clear out small spaces without damaging curbs and property. Kudos to this team for an amazing response to a historic snow event!

Speaking of streets, our Maintenance Department maintains more than 55 lane-miles of roadway within the Town of Purcellville. Responsibilities include pothole repair, asphalt replacement and/or sealing, sign maintenance, and curb and gutter (where applicable).

Sidewalks are a related component of street maintenance. Although not every street has a sidewalk, staff works to ensure that sidewalks are safe and maintained to Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards.

Another major area of the Department's responsibility is sewer line maintenance. Do you ever wonder what happens to your "waste" when you flush the toilet? Hopefully it has never backed up into your yard or home, but we know that sometimes obstructions and clogged drains can occur. Our Maintenance team is on-call 24/7 to help you if there's a sewer backup. Sometimes it's the homeowner's responsibility, and sometimes it's the Town's responsibility. Regardless, call us immediately and we'll let you know where the problem is. Our Emergency Maintenance number is 540-454-3629. ■


