21st and 23rd Streetscape Improvements: Phase II Project

Temporary Road Closure

PURCELLVILLE, Va. October 6, 2015 — On Monday, October 12, 2015, the Town's Contractor will be performing paving work on N. 21st Street between Main Street and north of O Street. This work is part of the 21st and 23rd Streetscape Improvements: Phase II project. During the paving, N. 21st Street between Main Street and north of O Street will be closed to through traffic between midnight and 5 PM. A detour around the work area will be implemented during this period and traffic will be required to use N. 23rd Street to detour around work zones.

ALL BUSINESSES WILL BE OPEN REGULAR BUSINESS HOURS. PARKING IS AVAILABLE AT THE TOWN PARKING LOTS ON WEST MAIN STREET AND NORTH 23RD STREET, AND WILL NOT BE LIMITED TO 2 HOUR PARKING DURING THIS WORK.

Please be aware of work zones and be alert for changes in vehicular and pedestrian traffic patterns in areas where work is being performed. In case of inclement weather, this work will be postponed until Monday, October 19, 2015.

After paving, the remaining work includes striping, stamped asphalt crosswalks, landscaping, installation of light posts, and items that may be identified during a final inspection process.
