10/25/2015 - 10:13p.m. 600 Blk. E. Main St. **Assault**

As a precaution, the school was evacuated and searched by police and specially trained police K-9's. Nothing suspicious was located and the students returned back to school. The threat that was made is being investigated by the Loudoun County Sheriff's Office Criminal Investigations Division.
