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REAL AND PERSONAL PROPERTY TAX BILL DUE DATES EXTENDED

PURCELLVILLE, Va. June 1, 2016 — The Town Council of Purcellville took action on Tuesday, May 24, 2016, to extend the due dates of Real Property and Personal Property Tax Bills to June 13, 2016. The Code of Virginia requires at least 14 days from the mailing of a tax bill to the due date. In an effort to provide the most time and flexibility for taxpayers, the Town of Purcellville strives to provide its taxpayers at least 30 days from the mailing of a tax bill to the due date. As a result of circumstances outside the control of Town staff, the tax bills were mailed later than usual and resulted in less than 30 days from the mail date to the due date.

These tax bills were mailed with an original due date of June 6, 2016. With the recent action taken by Council, no penalties or fees will be assessed for all payments made by 5:00pm on Monday, June 13th. Real Property taxes are for land and associated improvements (homes, buildings, and structures). Personal Property taxes are for personally-owned vehicles sited within the Town of Purcellville, to include an annual decal fee. Personal Property taxes are not prorated, meaning that only vehicles sited within the Town of Purcellville as of January 1st will be taxed for that year.

In addition to the Real and Personal Property tax bill extensions, the Business Personal Property tax deadline has been set as June 22, 2016. This is the date that was printed on the bill and remains effective.

Payments can be dropped in the secure drop box at Town Hall on the south side of the building (adjacent to J Street), in person during business hours of 8:00am-5:00pm, or mailed to Town Hall.
