## **WINE FESTIVAL PARKING, SHUTTLE AND TRAFFIC INFORMATION FOR SATURDAY, JULY 16**

**Purcellville, VA. (July 12, 2016)** – Purcellville’s Fifth Annual Wine & Food Festival will be held on Saturday, July 16<sup>th</sup> from 3:00 – 8:00 p.m. at Fireman’s Field, 250 S. Nursery Ave. Traffic throughout the Town will be impacted with visitors to the festival. Parking at Fireman’s Field and the Bush Tabernacle will be limited to those who need accessible parking (disabled permit required), vendors, volunteers, and sponsors of the Festival (with overflow parking provided at Loudoun Valley Community Center).

VIP guest parking is located at Emerick Elementary School.

Bus A - runs from 1:45pm – 8:45pm for VIP parking at Emerick Elementary School and Loudoun Valley Community Center

General Admission guests can park at the three public parking lots in the Town and walk to the Festival or use the complementary shuttle service running from the following locations throughout the Town. Shuttles run approximately every 20 minutes.

Bus B – runs from 2:45pm – 8:45pm from Blue Ridge Middle School and Blue Ridge Bible Church  
Bus C – runs from 2:45pm – 8:45pm from Patrick Henry College and Loudoun Valley High School

We encourage residents and other visitors to Purcellville to have patience during these hours and pay special attention to the heightened level of pedestrians and traffic. All patrons are expected to demonstrate appropriate activity and respect for private property at the various offsite parking locations. No consumption of alcohol is permitted at these locations.

### **The Town of Purcellville, Virginia**

Purcellville is an award-winning town of nearly 8,500 residents located in Loudoun County, approximately 40 miles west of Washington, DC. It has been honored for its green initiatives, most recently with the prestigious Siemens Sustainability Award for Small Communities. The Town has an elected Mayor and six Town Council members. Once a stop along the W&OD rail line, Purcellville has maintained its historic old-town feel through the restoration and maintenance of its many downtown structures, reflecting the Victorian architecture popular during the early 1900s. Today, Purcellville is the economic hub of western Loudoun County and a popular weekend destination for antiquing, entertainment, farmer’s markets, wineries, breweries, distilleries and restaurants.
