**PURCELLVILLE, Va. September 20, 2019 -**

**09/13/2019 11:10 a.m. 800 Block Woodbine Court Check on Welfare**

A parent called because of concerns about the mental health of an adult child. The responding officer met with both parties and after a fruitful discussion, facilitated the voluntary transport of the subject to a mental health facility for treatment.

**09/14/2019 2:23 a.m. 800 Block of E. Main Street Curfew Violation**

An officer on patrol observed three juveniles, 16, 15 and 15 years old walking down Main Street. They admitted to the officer that they were all supposed to be at the home of one of the 15 year olds. The officer spoke to the parent hosting the sleepover and returned the kids to his custody.

A party involved in a long simmering dispute between neighbors over the allegation of commercial activity in a residential neighborhood, alleged that he was assaulted while recording the activity with his phone. According the reporting party, the other party was upset about being recorded and confronted the reporting party and took the phone, deleting the recording. The calling party had no visible sign of injury and was provided with information on how to obtain a protective order.

Officers responded to assist medics with a number of intoxicated subjects, including two 16 year olds. The investigation revealed the two 18 year olds along with the two 16 year olds were drinking in the basement of the residence. The parents of one of 16 year olds and one of the 18 year olds were away on a trip. A responsible adult relative was placed in charge, but was unable to access the basement to check on the activity due to physical limitations.

One of the 16 year olds was transported by medic to the hospital, accompanied by a parent.

Officers on patrol observed a subject who appeared to be in some type of distress on the sidewalk near Walgreens. An officer trained in Crisis Intervention (CIT) engaged the subject, who indicated that he was having an anxiety attack. He thanked the officer for checking on him and hoped that they would approach, indicating that he wanted to ask for help but was afraid to do so, because he had previous bad

experiences with law enforcement in Newport News. Officers remained with the subject until his father arrived to take him home.

Officers responded for the report of Domestic Assault and Battery. The reporting party alleged an assault by an estranged spouse.
