## **WATER THEFT AWARENESS**

**PURCELLVILLE, Va. July 28, 2020** — The Town of Purcellville has recently experienced an increase in water theft. Citizens and businesses are encouraged to contact the Purcellville Police Department if a water theft is witnessed.

Water theft is the unauthorized hookup to the Town's water distribution system either by taking water from a fire hydrant, meter setter, or tampering with a water meter. Tampering with the water system is illegal per Town Code Sec. 82-86.

### **Water theft imposes the following risks:**

- Creating an unnecessary burden of water use restrictions to citizens
- Water Contamination
- Destruction to Infrastructure
- Damage to hydrants or meters
- Low Water Pressure
- Threatens Fire Protection

### **Water Theft is Illegal**

Anyone caught stealing water from the Town of Purcellville's water system will have their meter and equipment confiscated by the Town. The Town of Purcellville staff will contact the owner of the meter to obtain the last recorded reading, then bill the offender for the difference at the bulk water rate, and impose a fine from \$1,000-\$2,000 based on number of offenses. Additionally, the offender may be subject to criminal charges as well as court fees.

Town residents may receive a credit on their utility bill for reporting a water theft in progress. Please call the non-emergency police dispatch at 703-777-1021 to report an incident. Your name must be on the police report in order to obtain the reward of a \$50 credit to your water bill.

**REMEMBER:** Only the Town of Purcellville staff and the Fire Department is authorized to access fire hydrants and water meters!
