**CALL TO LOCAL NON-PROFITS TO PARTICIPATE IN FIRST ANNUAL
PURCELLVILLE NON-PROFIT EXPO**

PURCELLVILLE, Va., March 18, 2021 —The Purcellville Parks and Recreation Advisory Board is hosting its first Purcellville Non-Profit Expo. This year’s event will be virtual and will highlight up to 20 non-profit organizations that serve Purcellville residents. The organizations, which may include civic, sports, arts, scouts, etc., will have an opportunity to share information about their organization, while residents will be able to learn about the non-profits, understand the services offered, and find out how to get involved with and provide support to the non-profits. Once a stop along the W&OD rail line, which has been converted to a multi-use trail from Alexandria, VA to Purcellville, the Town has maintained its historic old-town feel through the restoration and maintenance of its many downtown structures, reflecting the Victorian architecture popular during the early 1900s. Today, Purcellville is the economic hub of western Loudoun County and a popular weekend destination for antiquing, equestrian activities, farmer’s markets, wineries, breweries, distilleries and restaurants.
