**TOWN OF PURCELLVILLE TO CONTINUE PHASED
REOPENING OF TOWN HALL**

PURCELLVILLE, Va. May 26, 2021 — The Town of Purcellville began the initial phase of reopening Town Hall to the public in May starting with Mayor Fraser’s State of the Town Address. In addition to the existing virtual platform for Town Council meetings, the ability for citizens to once again join meetings in-person began May 11.

Beginning Wednesday, June 2, 2021, the Town Hall will reopen to the public for walk-in service. This phase of the reopening will be in effect on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday, from 9:00 am until 1:00 pm. This will be expanded as we continue the transition back to full-time on-site operations.

As has been the case throughout the pandemic, Town Hall employees remain available to provide assistance, via phone and email, during the hours of 8:30 am- 4:30 pm, Monday – Friday. If an urgent need arises, on a case by case basis, staff will work with citizens to accommodate requests for in-person service during the times and days Town Hall is closed to the general public. Staff is also able to coordinate meetings, via a virtual platform, to address citizen and business needs. For assistance you may call (540) 338-7421.

In alignment with the latest guidance from the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), and Governor Northam’s Executive Order Number Seventy-Nine, the Town will no longer require visitors to Town Hall to wear masks, if fully-vaccinated. For those who are unvaccinated or not fully vaccinated, we do ask that you please wear a mask and continue social distancing protocols when visiting Town Hall.

We look forward to opening the doors of Town Hall and seeing members of the community in-person. Stay tuned for further updates.
