### **SUMMARY and RECOMMENDATIONS:**

### **BACKGROUND:**

This monthly report provides an overview of criminal activity within the Town of Purcellville. The report outlines the previous month's crime activity, with comparisons to the same period of the previous year. Also provided are clearance numbers for arrests.

Productivity information includes; calls for service, officer initiated activity, reports written, vehicular crashes handled, and the number of hours the town was patrolled by a single officer. Also included in this report are traffic citation data and traffic study results. This data assists the Police Department in developing strategies in combating crime, assessing the patrol officer's workload, and maintaining the highest quality of life possible for residents and visitors within the Town.






YTD 2020 Crime Part 0 by Community Policing Districts



YTD 2020 Crime Part 1 by Community Policing Districts




## YTD 2020 Crime Part 2 by Community Policing Districts

## **Traffic Studies**

The Purcellville Police Department and Public Works conducted a traffic study June 8-14, 2020 on North and South Bound Maple Avenue at Dominion Terrace.

### North Bound

- The posted speed limit is 25 mph
- 11087 vehicles total traveled NB during the study period
- The combined 85th percentile speed for N bound traffic was 29 mph. This means 85% of the vehicles were traveling at this speed or slower
- Approximately 59% of the vehicles were traveling the posted speed limit or slower
- Approximately 95% of the vehicles were traveling 30 mph or slower
- Approximately 99% of the vehicles were traveling 35 mph or slower
- Approximately .5% of the vehicles were traveling in excess of 35 mph

### South Bound

- The posted speed limit is 25 mph
- 20706 vehicles total traveled SB during the study period
- The combined 85th percentile speed for S bound traffic was 32 mph. This means 85% of the vehicles were traveling at this speed or slower
- Approximately 35% of the vehicles were traveling the posted speed limit or slower
- Approximately 84% of the vehicles were traveling 30 mph or slower
- Approximately 98% of the vehicles were traveling 35 mph or slower
- Approximately 2% of the vehicles were traveling in excess of 35 mph

The numbers captured indicate a low percentage of enforceable violations (10 mph over the posted limit) traveling North bound and South bound. Based on this information the police will continue with a strategy of random/rotating enforcement, with the goal of compliance even when police are not present. More emphasis will be based on vehicles traveling South bound.
