### **SUMMARY and RECOMMENDATIONS:**

### **BACKGROUND:**

This monthly report provides an overview of criminal activity within the Town of Purcellville. The report outlines the previous month's crime activity, with comparisons to the same period of the previous year. Also provided are clearance numbers for arrests.

## **Traffic Studies**

The Purcellville Police Department and Public Works conducted a traffic study May 11-24, 2020 on North and South bound Baffin Place.

### North Bound

- The posted speed limit is 25 mph
- 1321 vehicles total traveled NB during the study period
- The combined 85th percentile speed for N bound traffic was 16.5 mph. This means 85% of the vehicles were traveling at this speed or slower
- Approximately 99% of the vehicles were traveling the posted speed limit or slower
- One (1) vehicle exceeded the posted speed limit

### South Bound

- The posted speed limit is 25 mph
- 2267 vehicles total traveled SB during the study period
- The combined 85th percentile speed for S bound traffic was 18 mph. This means 85% of the vehicles were traveling at this speed or slower
- 100% of the vehicles were traveling the posted speed limit or slower.

The numbers captured indicate no enforceable violations (10 mph over the posted limit) traveling on Baffin Place. Based on the information the police will continue with a strategy of random/rotating enforcement, with the goal of compliance even when police are not present.
